RENEWABLES ON THE RISE

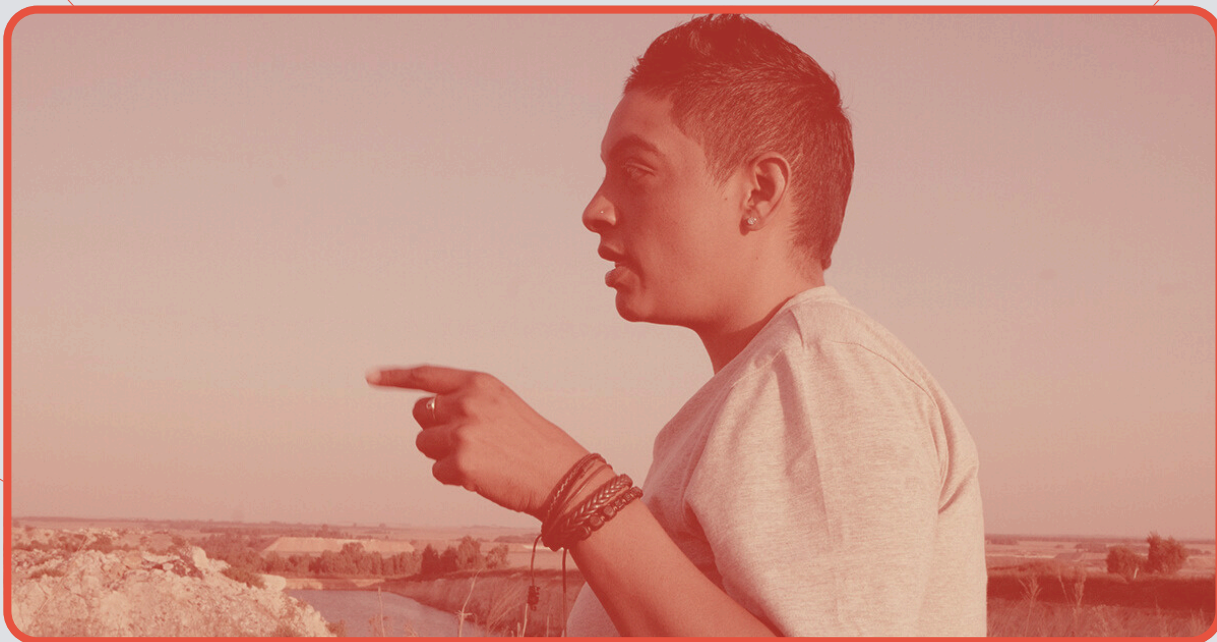
There has been a continued uptake of renewable energy projects in Mpumalanga, with a notable spike in 2023, several coming online in 2024 and even more planned for subsequent years.

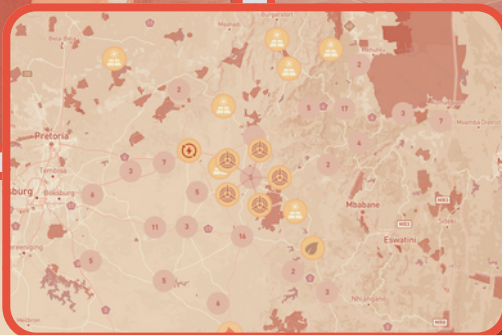
